Math

Review multiplication facts—https://www.multiplication.com/ This is a simple exercise but very critical. Flashcards are a great way to learn facts.

Reading

Students can read books, magazines, short stories, poetry, and newspapers. Students should read a *minimum* of 30 minutes a day.
